## This Child Belongs to God!

I have baptism on my mind a lot lately. Perhaps this is in part due to the fact that we have recently started a study of baptism in our Sunday morning Bible study. Perhaps it is also due to the fact that our youth confirmation class is currently studying the topic of Holy Baptism. In truth, though, the reason that baptism is on my mind is because of the recent birth of our son Elijah. We look forward to bringing him to the baptismal font where he will receive the benefits that God gives in baptism.

What benefits does baptism give? Luther writes in the small catechism, "It works forgiveness of sin, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare." Luther's answer reminds us that Baptism is entirely the work of God, that he cleanses us and makes us His own through baptism. Titus 3:5 speaks of the marvelous work God does in baptism saying, "He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom he poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life."

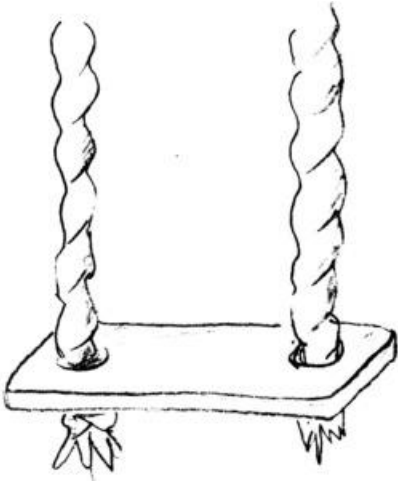
Back in Luther's day the Rite of Holy Baptism began with something called the exsufflation. The pastor would blow three times under the child's eyes and say, "Depart thou unclean spirit, and give room for the Holy Spirit." This exsufflation was not necessary for baptism, and is no longer a part of our baptismal rite today (Perhaps too many babies complained about pastor's breath). However, it did help teach why baptism is so important even for infants, and it proclaimed what God is doing through the water and the Word. God, in Baptism, is releasing that child from the dominion of Satan, and sending His Holy Spirit to dwell in the child. It is as if God is saying, "Satan, you no longer belong here! Get out! The victory and life which Jesus won at the cross now belongs to this little one. This child belongs to me!"

This is the way God would have think about our own baptism, looking in faith to all the promises God has given us in Christ Jesus. In Christ Jesus we have been freed from the dominion of Satan, and in baptism God has given us "the washing of rebirth and renewal in the Holy Spirit." You belong to him. To sustain us in this faith which was begun in baptism, God continues to teach us through his Word and proclaim to us all that done in Christ that "we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life."

I encourage everyone in the congregation to join us for our Sunday morning Bible study as we take a closer look at the marvelous way that God works through baptism. Though our baptism is a gift that we only receive once, the blessings and comfort of baptism remain as through the Holy Spirit we learn and grow in faith.

# From the Board of Stewardship

---



**In June we celebrate Father's Day.** A good and godly father is one of the best earthly gifts that anyone can have. Those of us who have had good and godly fathers know this to be true. A good and godly father loves his children and shows that love by giving good things to them. In His Sermon on the Mount Jesus pointed out that that even evil fathers know how to give good gifts to their children, like giving bread instead of a stone or giving a fish instead of a snake (Matthew 7:9-10 NIV)). Jesus went on to say that if earthly fathers know how to give good gifts to their children, then how much more will our Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him!

We are children of the Heavenly Father because of what Jesus has done for us through His suffering, death and resurrection. Our sins are taken away because Jesus took upon Himself the punishment that we deserved and paid our debt in full! What this means, among other things, is that we are now able to freely and joyfully live as God's redeemed stewards.

A steward is not a slave who has to do the master's bidding; but is instead a steward who has the privilege and responsibility to manage of all that our Heavenly Father entrusts to each of us. We call that by the title of "all of life and life's resources." We confess with the Scriptures that "*The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world and all who live in it.*" (Psalm 24:1 NIV) When we acknowledge this truth then we can grow in our understanding of the difference between being an owner or a manager.

Dr. Martin Luther said it so well in his explanation of the First Article of the Apostles' Creed.

**I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth.**

What does this mean?

*I believe that God has made me and all creatures; that He has given me my body and soul; eyes, ears, and all my members, my reason and all my senses and still takes care of them.*

*He has also given me clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals, and all I need. He daily and richly provides me with all that I need to support this body and life.*

*He defends me against all danger and guards and protects me from all evil.*

*All this He does only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me. For all this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him.*

All that we do as children of the Heavenly Father is our stewardship—a response to His amazing grace and extravagant love. **THIS IS MOST CERTAINLY TRUE!**

## **LWML ANNOUNCES TOTAL MITES GATHERED FOR BIENNIUM**

At the 33<sup>rd</sup> biennial convention held in Portland, Oregon, in June 2009, a mite goal of \$1,825,000. Was set for the 2009-2011 biennium. Mite funds received during this biennium totaled \$1,778,273.36, which is a shortage of \$46,726.64.

The Rocky Mountain District LWML Mite goal of \$75,000.00 remains to be met in full prior to the convention in June, 2012, in El Paso, TX. One of the 12 grants to be paid includes "Support for the University Lutheran Chapel in Boulder, CO", (Pastor Burhop's congregation), which, at this writing, has \$3,000.00 of the \$6,000.00 grant paid.

**Running on Empty** Excerpts from an article by Dr. James Lamb,  
Executive Director of Lutherans For Life.

**"And he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus; he is not here. See the place where they laid him.'" Mark 16:6**

"Running on empty" may sound contradictory when describing the Christian life, but consider what the author of Hebrews says. We run the race set before us "looking to Jesus" the risen and ascended Savior "seated at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:1). We "run on empty," that is, we run filled with hope that comes from an empty tomb and the promise it brings.

- We "run on empty" because the empty tomb assures us that our faith is not in vain (1 Corinthians 15:17).
- We "run on empty" because the empty tomb assures us that we have an imperishable and "living hope" (1 Peter 1:3).
- We "run on empty" because the empty tomb assures us that Jesus Christ is victorious over sin and death (1 Corinthians 15:54-55).

The empty tomb is more than a Sunday school story or some historical site with a church built upon it. The empty tomb proclaims a message of hope and victory tailor-made for people feeling hopeless and defeated because they face difficult situations in their lives.

LFL continues to equip Lutheran pastors, educators, and congregations to apply this Easter message to the life issues. No other message can "lift hearts" or bring "lightness" to hearts as this message.

## June 5 – Seventh Sunday of Easter

We usually do not equate suffering persecution because we share a For Life message with being "insulted for the name of Christ" (1 Peter 4:14). But when that For Life message comes from God's holy Word, then they do equate. Sharing the truth of life is proclaiming the name of the Lord of Life.

## June 12 – The Day of Pentecost

Some will always mock even when the Holy Spirit is at work right in front of their eyes (Acts 2:13). You can mock God's truth but it will not change its reality or its power.

## June 19 – The Holy Trinity

Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—at work in Creation (Genesis 1:1-2:4a), at work in new creation (Matthew 28:19). Both actions give inestimable value to human life.

## June 26 – Second Sunday after Pentecost

We serve others, not in the old way of the law; rather "we serve in the new way of the Spirit" (Romans 7:6b). We serve others, especially the vulnerable and needy, because they are Christ to us; and we in serving are Christ to them.

# Taking a Tour of Heaven

---

What do the parts of the liturgy mean? This is a frequently asked question; maybe you have asked that question yourself. The following descriptions of worship and the parts of liturgy were first published in an article entitled "Taking a Tour of Heaven." This month we take a look at Confession and Absolution.



## *Confession and Absolution*

We can indeed approach God with confidence. And yet, because we stand on this side of our Lord's final return, we still have with us the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh. We have not yet faced the final judgment. And so, with sin still working in us, the condemnation of God's Law must still confront us, lest we have any delusions that we might have something to boast of before our mighty Judge.

Above all else, Confession and Absolution keep us honest—honest with ourselves and honest before God. The act of confession is not some work that we lay before the Father's throne; rather, it is the simple acknowledgment that God's Word is true and right and that when we measure ourselves against its demands, we come up short. God's Word says "you shall not give false testimony," but in truth we have lied and gossiped and slandered." And so, the Christian confesses: "Lord, Your Word is true; I have sinned."

There are three basic ways to handle sin and guilt. One is to ignore or minimize them. We've all been tempted in that direction more than a few times. Isn't that, after all, what our sinful human nature is all about? Another way is to institutionalize them, especially the guilt part. After all, if you can keep people feeling just guilty enough, you will keep them coming back for more.

The third way is to give sin and guilt their proper due, and then to silence them. That is the way of God's absolution. With his forgiveness, our sin is removed from us as far as the east is from the west. Christians know that, but they also need to hear it often. We need to be reminded that those familiar words, "I forgive you all your sins," are not just some impersonal announcement. They say what they mean and accomplish what they promise. Jesus himself said to his disciples that the sins they forgive are forgiven (John 20:23).

The last and greatest absolution that will ever be spoken to us will be at the last judgment. In the final pages of the *Chronicles of Narnia*, C.S. Lewis provides a marvelous description of this event. As each individual comes before Aslan—the lion who is Lewis' figure for Christ—one of two things happens: either the person gazes directly into Aslan's face and recognizes his forgiving countenance, or, upon seeing the lion's stern demeanor, passes into his long shadow, forever to be separated from Christ.

In the Confession and Absolution we are being readied for our appearance before Christ on the Last Day. And hidden behind those comforting words that our sins are forgiven is the invitation, "Come, you who are blessed by my father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world" (Mt. 25:34). When our Lord speaks those words to us at the Last Day, Confession and Absolution as we know it will cease, for we will then bask in the eternal absolution of the Lamb.

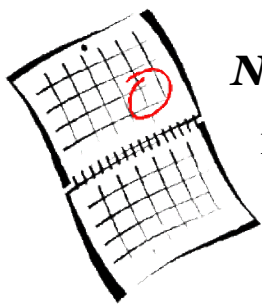
